### **Experience: Three Examples of Open Health**

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#### **1. The Sovinty solution: real-time online pre- and post-operative monitoring**

The Sovinty solution allows a patient to fill in an online questionnaire before going to hospital for an operation. It reassures both the patient and the practitioner. It reinforces the safety of the surgical procedure.

On returning home, the patient continues to enter information online to describe his condition and permit post-operative monitoring in real-time. The ultimate goal is to give patients information to facilitate their recovery. It is simple and intuitive. Which is why it has been accepted by 94% of patients who have been offered it.

#### **2. The Korian telemedicine solution**

With telemedicine facilities developing in outlying regions, the Korian project has been launched by French regional health agencies (ARS). Using a camera, retirement-home nursing staff can send snapshots to dentists. The data transfer is secure. Based on the photos, the dentist can produce a report and guide the resident to the right consultation for their condition.

This operating principle can be extended to other fields such as dermatology, cardiology, hearing tests, etc. These tools permit rapid assessment and avoids physically taking the patient to A&E. Although they offer significant health and economic benefits, their development is held back by trustees having no socioeconomic model to handle it.
